
Faith for the future

Female empowerment in South Sudan

Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing

1 Thessalonians 5:11

One of our programmes in South Sudan looks at the difference of responsibility between women and men. This is called the 24 hour clock participatory learning activity. It is known as the safest way to bring up gender equality in these communities.

The 24 hour clock activity aims to highlight how much work and responsibility falls on the women in a day.

On the daily activity chart, the women's day was filled with cleaning, washing, cooking and looking after the children.

In contrast, the father has activities such as reading the Bible, listening to the radio, going to community meetings and watching sport.

It reveals the levels of responsibility in the household. Despite the men believing they have a full day, the activity shows that this is not the case. By supplying the women of the household this knowledge, it gives them the confidence to ask for help and raise their voice, not only for themselves but for their children.

This tool gave women in Juba the confidence to 'give some duties to my children' and redistribute some of their daily tasks. The learning trickles down into the community from the initial training, and one woman 'educated the [neighbour] girl on the daily activity chart'.

We also run literacy circles. They use interactive Bible studies and learning activities. The literacy circles contain up to 30 participants and are led by community volunteers trained by Mothers' Union. The literacy circle becomes a safe place where all participants feel secure. They trust each other to share deep issues affecting their lives, which included gender-based violence, women's rights, understanding traditional practices, health and hygiene. It enables women to use their voice, often for the first time and speak freely, helping to promote female leadership.

Around 70% of participants in Juba now feel they have coping mechanisms as well as being involved in advocacy activities for peace in their communities.

Reflection



Knitting teddies for Ukraine refugees**FAITH IN ACTION**

And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased.

Hebrews 13:16

Since war started in Ukraine in 2022, families have been fleeing their homes to find safe havens. This means a lot of children have left their lives behind, including family and friends, for an unknown life in the UK.

Mothers' Union Manchester were contacted by Manchester Airport Chaplaincy Team asking them for help. They knitted teddies for a charity called Teddies 4 Tragedies. The movement started as a pattern for knitted teddies intended to bring comfort and hope to children around the world. Members involved in knitting groups throughout greater Manchester started knitting. Tricia

Deanery, Leader for Bury and Rossendale, agreed to coordinate the project.

Over 140 teddies have been knitted. Tricia sent some knitted bears direct to the Ukrainian front line via a volunteer, and has planned to send more.

Reverend George Lane, a member of the airport chaplaincy team, has been on the front line at the airport welcoming Ukrainian refugees. "The purpose... is to reassure the children – and their anxious siblings and parents that they are safe and among friends. We have no idea of the immediate situation before they boarded their flights to the UK."

Members have offered their homes, essential living supplies and love to Ukrainian refugees.



Supporting fathers in prison

FAITH IN ACTION

Continue to remember those in prison as if you were in prison with them...

Hebrews 13:3

Mothers' Union works in a number of prisons in a variety of ways - knitting hats for the prisoners, supporting families and running crèches.

During Covid, the visits to prisons had to cease completely due to lockdown both for MU members and visitors, which was a struggle for family relationships. Once visits were permitted again, physical contact was still not allowed due to social distancing, which was a continued strain on the prisoners and their families. Children were not able to hug or touch their parent in prison.

Mothers' Union Diocese of Worcester shared how they support fathers in prison in various ways. 'Baby Bags' are provided for the prisoners who are expecting a baby. The dad's then have something to give their new babies when they are visited and it gives them the best positive start as a new father.

The bag may consist of items such as a knitted cardigan, booties, blanket and toiletries for both baby and the mum. Mothers' Union also provides something for the new dad to give to their partner separately to encourage loving relationships.

Mothers' Union Diocese of Worcester also supports during larger Family Days. For the Family Day at HMP in May half term 2023, there was a Teddy Bears picnic theme, which incorporated the celebration of the Coronation of King Charles III. To mark this special occasion Mothers' Union was asked for teddies complete with crowns to give out to the children of prisoners. The teddies are also crafted to give to children visiting the prison and so were much appreciated by visitors.



Continuing our work against FGM**FAITH IN ACTION****God is within her, she will not fall; God will help her at break of day**

Psalms 46:5

In Tanzania, Diocese of Mara, Mothers' Union members are fighting against female genital mutilation (FGM). Faith House, an organisation run by Mothers' Union, has been working with young girls since February 2015. Their aim is to protect girls in the community and educate them about the effects of FGM, gender-based violence and child marriage.

Since the organisation started, 500 girls have been rescued from FGM, providing temporary residence to girls who flee from their families or caregivers. Faith House visits the girls' family and works to reconcile the victims of FGM and/or early marriage with their parents and relatives. This

only takes place once the District Social Welfare Officer has thoroughly researched both the family and the girl. If they feel the girl will not be safe back at home, they wait for some time to pass then go back to the home to discuss again. Only when an agreement is made are the girls taken back.

When in the care of Faith House, the girls are enrolled in classes, as well as attending school. Faith House also monitors girls who accomplish their training at the centre once they return home to make sure they continue to be safe and cared for. As soon as a girl turns 18 she is seen as a grown up and able to make her own decisions. Faith House will continue to work on their important vision: to build the community which is free from traditional ties and bad beliefs.

Reflection

For two decades, Mothers' Union has been working to promote literacy and education in Burundi, with a particular focus on empowering women.

Over a 20 year period, the programme in Burundi trained nearly 1,300 facilitators to work locally within communities and directly benefitted over 165,000 participants. Over 144,000 of the participants are now accredited as both literate and numerate. They can now access loans and save money due to the numeracy skills acquired from these programmes. The course promoted financial stability and expanded beyond the classrooms across the community.

In June 2023 we released a report that looks at the long term impacts of our Literacy and Financial Education Programme in Burundi. We received coverage from *Church Times* highlighting the impact. The important impacts of the programme are:

Gender equality and women's empowerment

- 86% of female and 90% of male programme participants reported reduced domestic and intimate partner violence
- 165,400 participants, 77% women, have benefitted from the programme

Financial Empowerment

- 88% of female participants have increased personal income
- 80% of women were no longer financially dependent on their husbands

Transformation of Families

- 78% can afford higher education for their children
- 96% can afford health insurance

Helping Mothers' Union deliver its mandate sustainably

- 6,650 of the Mothers' Union Burundi members have been accredited literate

Contributing to community development and nation building

- 98% of participants have improved relations with neighbours and community

Faith in Action

- Nearly all the programme participants reported that they can read the Bible for themselves

One MU coordinator in the Diocese of Makamba noted, "It opened the eyes of the participants... they started to question some cultural values that hindered girls' education... women are no longer powerless... they have dignity."




